Renaissance Venice was a proud, prosperous and cosmopolitan city, famous in many ways – for its dominance on the seas and trade with the east, for its independence from the Pope in Rome, for having the most beautiful women in Europe, and as we all know so well, for its music and musicians. Our workshop will explore some of the riches of this music written, published or perhaps just played in Venice from the early 16th century through the first part of the 17th century, from the Frottolists to the mannerist Madrigalists, via the music of the wonderful composers whose work for the Doges in the basilica of San Marco is the hallmark of the Venetian style that was exported throughout Europe.

Venice was a renowned center of instrument building and it is possible that the first viols to be built in Italy were made there on commission from Isabella d'Este. Venice also dominated the music printing industry in Europe for much of the 16th century, and composers from many places well beyond Italy came to Venice to supervise the publication of their works. Such trips by composers helped to popularize Venetian music everywhere in Europe.

In addition to music published by Petrucci, the ricercare of Musica Nova, works by composers such Willaert, Da Rore, Monteverdi the Gabrielis and more, we will also consider the textless madrigals by Pallavicino, Marenzio and other Italians preserved in manuscripts at Christ Church, Oxford. Coaches will be Lisa Terry, Beverly Au, Ros Morley, and Larry Lipnik.

As always, VdGS-NE welcomes beginners at its workshops. For details see the registration pages. Coaches will be Hannah Davidson and James Perretta.
